The wild flowers of the Namakwa are an unforgettable natural phenomenon and best discovered on foot, which makes it ultimately appealing to keen photographers, hikers and outdoor enthusiasts.

Experience the Namakwa in all its floral finery as the landscape is covered with a flamboyant spread of wild flowers. Popular flower spots include the Goegap Nature Reserve in Springbok, the Namakwa National Park near Kamieskroon and the world's bulb capital in Niewoudtville.
